



- Free meeting place all about repairing things
- Cultivates culture of repair
- Taps into local resources
- Started by Martine Postma, who founded Repair Café Foundation





Why Repair Cafes?



- Reduce landfill waste
- Cultivate culture of repair
- Confirm the right to fix it
- Build community

Making our things last longer is both more efficient and more cost-effective than mining them for raw materials.

Fixing things is often free, and usually cheaper than replacing them. Doing the repair yourself saves you money.

REPAIR TEACHES ENGINEERING

The best way to find out how something works is to take it apart.

Organizing Process

- 1. Pick place & time
- 2. Recruit volunteers
- 3. Advertise
- 4. Gather materials
- 5. Host event
- 6. Evaluate results

- Encourage fixers to work together




No Guarantees

Waivers

CVSWMD

- Waive volunteer liability
- House Rules poster
- One item at a time







1. Check-in table

Sign rules & waiver. Fill out routing slip.







2. Routing table

Weigh item. Leave item & routing slip. Volunteer chooses item and calls out name.









3. Repair tables

Attendees participate as fixer repairs item.







4. After the event

Homework sheet for next steps. Connect with fixers and other repair services.



What Worked




- Reached out to RC organizers in other states

Lessons Learned

- Lots of paperwork
- Signing in on laptops did not work
- Fixer cancellations led to long wait times



Lessons Learned



- Training next person/group to organize
- Need a budget!
- Formalizing partnerships
- Communicating with partners



Future Directions


- Repair & diagnostic tutorial videos
