

What We Do

- Help most people with trash bags

Cost Avoidance Calculation

- Revenue + Avoided Disposal Cost
- Because it is a lot more than just revenue!

CARDBOARD EXAMPLE:

- Ship out 20 Tons at \$50/Ton
- Landfill Cost (w/Trans.) = \$100/Ton
- Revenue 20 x \$50 = \$1000
- Avoided 20 x \$100 = \$2000
- Cost Avoidance \$1000 + \$2000 = \$3000
- \$3000/20 = \$150 per Ton
